Message from Executive Director Mary Ann LeRay

I am so excited to share the updates since our last newsletter!

Great progress is being made in fulfilling our mission of assisting with unmet needs in the areas of Nutrition, Education and Connection.
Our annual Board Training was held on July 17, 2021 at Triune Holiness Church in Maysville. We are grateful to Triune and Sheri Smith, our

board secretary, for hosting our meeting. During our time together, we worked on the Strategic Plan 2021-2025 and outlining the goals making sure the unmet needs of Jones County residents are being filled. Also at this meeting, the Executive Committee recommended and voted to offer the Executive Director position and I ac-

cepted. My heart is wrapped up in this great mission given to the church partners of Jones County. What a privilege to have the opportunity to work with our Board of Directors, volunteers, partners and donors!

Look how God has been blessing the mission!

- North Carolina Community Foundation funded a grant of \$40,000 from the Healing Communities Fund which will be used for general operations
- We received a grant of \$8600 from the VFG Fund through the Governor's Commission to hire a volunteer coordinator and create a training plan.
- 922 households were served from the Food Pantry July/August 2021

- 328.25 Volunteer Hours were logged July/August 2021
- 30 children benefited from the Art, Dance and Music Education during the week of July 19th made possible through a partnership with Atlantic Dance Theatre and NC Symphony
 - Perfect 10 Fundraiser will be held October 10, 2021 - goal is to raise \$25,000 for the renovation and building of a teaching kitchen. We are delighted to have CarolinaEast Health Systems as our Title Sponsor!
 - 150 children received new backpacks with non-perishable food/snacks at the Back to School Bash held at Jones Sr.

High School/Partnership event with Jones County Parks and Recreation

 Asphalt Project completed with the leadership of John Taylor, Building and Grounds Chair

The Filling Station celebrates its 4th Anniversary August 2021.


Staff Spotlight: Geraldine Eubanks





Idea for Praying on Hunger

Taken from Tearfund: Enough Food For Everyone IF:

Unity adds another dimension to our praying. As we join together with others in the Body of Christ to make our requests before God, our agreement has power. We encourage you to make space in your church services or small group meetings to pray for the hungry.

- As a symbolic act ask people to line up to receive a handful of rice each. (If you can try to estimate 80g /3oz of rice before and use this same method of measuring as you distribute - it can be a small container). For many in our world, this small portion represents their daily food intake.
- Invite people to spend 5 minutes in silence, feeling the rice in their hands and reflecting on what it would be like to have so little food, and so little variety in their diet.
- Invite everyone to use this silent time to let God's Spirit stir up a prayer within them. It doesn't have to be clever or complex ... it should just be a heartcry to God.
- Then give 5 minutes for people to pray together in groups, or to speak their prayers out loud for the whole group.
- At the end of the service or small group you can gather up the rice that was distributed in a container and use it in a communal meal.
