The Filling Station—a Happening Place!

The New Year program rollout for 2022 has been almost like walking a red carpet. With a brilliant Board of Directors, gifted consultants, compassionate volunteers and powerful partners, we continue to assist with filling unmet needs with more enthusiasm than the year before.

Our big project for January was to create and deliver a comprehensive Annual Report for 2021. We were able to publish a first class publication with the help of Judy Hills, Editor and Anita Cook, Copy and Print Warehouse and the tracking detail from Geraldine Eubanks, Volunteer Coordinator and Solid Rock Accounting, Kelly Michaud. We continue to be blessed with incredible talent.

Our current programs - The Food Pantry and Lenoir Community College Computer Lab are assisting in meeting needs here in Jones County. Each week we are serving residents from Pollocksville, Trenton, Maysville, Comfort, Long Point and a few from surrounding counties. During these cold, winter mornings, The Food Pantry distributed hats, gloves and scarves, and socks for men, women and children. The word is getting out to Jones County Schools that we can assist in bridging the gap for items such as hand soap, bottled water, wipes, and backpacks.

New Volunteer Enrichment Program kicked off in January through a partnership with Atlantic Dance Theater. Jane Peele provides a gentle stretching for adults 3 times a month and 2 dance education classes for a homeschool group once a month. In February, we offered our 1st Volunteer Orientation and Onboarding Session. Our volunteers are our greatest asset and it is our goal to provide orientation and training to everyone associated with The Filling Station. Want to volunteer? We are part of a NEW Advisory Council with N.C. Cooperative Extension to develop our nutrition education plan for the teaching kitchen coming this summer. Recipe samples will be distributed during Food Pantry hours beginning March 29th. Our Garden Venue continues to unfold with two Eagle Scout projects providing educational panels and benches. The Community Artists and Gallery from New Bern will be donating two pieces of art for the garden coming in the Spring. We are partnering with N. C. Cooperative Extension -Horticulture Agent, Lisa Rayburn, to assist us in planning a perennial, sustainable garden to meet the needs of the mission. The Art, Dance and Music Camp for children is coming again this summer along with a Garden Camp.

"Bridging Communities" makes us stronger. We are ONLY 6 weeks away from the Neuse River Bridge Run which helps The Filling Station keep "running". We are excited that Jones County Parks and Recreation is encouraging the students to get involved for their health and give back to local nonprofits.

Starting Tuesday, March 29th, Sara Ware, Food Coordinator with NC Cooperative Extension will be distributing recipe samples to the clients.

Volunteer Spotlight: The Coastal Carolina Church








Teaching Kitchen Making Progress


