Message from Mary Ann

P&L is most often referred to as "Profit and Loss". As important as the Financials are for an organization, we believe P&L is "People and Love". Everything flows from the heart. Earlier this year, I was asked to share The Filling Station story at a women's conference held at Triune Holiness Church. In an effort to leave an impression with over 200 women, each woman was given a RED heart shaped stress ball with The Filling Station logo stamped on it. Our mission is to assist with filling unmet needs in the areas of Nutrition, Education and Connection serving the residents of Jones County. When we remain focused on the hearts of those we serve, it allows us to work in a way that fills our souls.

Now, when anyone mentions the "hard work" we are doing, we respond "you mean the heart work".

During the Balanced Non-Profit Workshop held at Craven Community College and organized by New Bern Non-Profit Council, I shared the difference between HARD and HEART work during one of our sessions.

HARD—Remove D (demand)—HEART—add E (encourage) and add T (time).

In addition, did you know? The word encourage comes from the Old French word encouragier, meaning "make strong, hearten."

As we work together to deliver this important work through the Leadership Academy, Nutrition Classes in the Teaching Kitchen, hosting HAM radio classes for the community,

staying prepared for disasters and operating our Food Pantry each week, it takes a lot of HEART to make the engine run.

In September, you will see a recap of the summer camps we are currently running on campus. It continues to amaze me day after day how this organization continues to flourish. From generous donors, foundations, volunteers and staff, the mission is being "filled". In just a few months, we will host our 3rd Annual Event called "Jones County - A Perfect 10" on Ten Mile Fork Road on October 7, 2023. We are grateful to the wonderful hosts who open their farms, homes and businesses to promote awareness and raise important funding to continue the great work while also sharing the beauty of Jones County. 

Church Supporter Highlight: Solid Rock Global Methodist

Solid Rock Global Methodist Church was started by a group of faithful people from Trinity United Methodist Church in New Bern who, when they voted for disaffiliation from the UMC, barely missed the 2/3 majority vote required. Led by Pastor Bryan Huffman, they bound together to form the first Global Methodist Church plant in North Carolina.

Organizational meetings were held at Rhems Methodist Church, and they, along with Garber Methodist Church and Highland Park Christian Church, graciously hosted Solid Rock meetings and worship for the first few months.

The initial group of members coming from Trinity UMC numbered 87. We have since had 24 more people join the church, and those members have come from different congregations in the area. We have a wonderful choir of 21 members. As we grow, our church is active in evangelism and missions, and we are looking for more opportunities to serve in Jesus' name.

Solid Rock member Heather Thornburg presented the Filling Station information as a topic of discussion for the church in early 2023, and Missions Committee chair Dave Davis went to an orientation session there.



He thoroughly enjoyed the session and felt a great moving of the Spirit in that place. On March 20, the men's and women's groups of the church had a combined meeting to which Mary Ann LeRay was invited. She came and presented the history, mission, and programs offered by the Filling Station. She also brought Bobby Darden, who serves on the board and gave his witness as to the effectiveness of its programs. Ten more church members have since been through the orientation. The Missions Committee all agreed to have our members serve on the first Tuesday of the month with food distribution, and also to fix lunch one day during the Dance and Art camp in June.














Jones County Heritage Festival—September 22-23


