Message from Mary Ann

July and August were full of excitement with various camps on campus making use of the NEWLY renovated building. First, we hosted a Dance, Art and Music Camp with Kono Gnaga from Mali, Africa. The name of the camp "Grow Yourself, Grow Your World". Solo, lead dance instructor, along with two professional drummers from Greensboro and New York instructed the 14 children (ages 8-11) in dance and drum classes. Art Class was full of wonderful projects such as making your own drum and drumsticks, painting pottery and creating beautiful fabrics with African themed stamps. The NC Symphony brought Music Education to the Garden Venue and shared various instruments with the children on Wednesday morning. Community members, children from Pollocksville Presbyterian Childcare and parents were invited to attend this special morning with music. The children were treated to delicious lunches by Solid Rock Global Methodist Church, Sarah Ware, N.C Cooperative Extension, led cooking class and Geraldine Eubanks, Volunteer Coordinator Hilda Bender, volunteer and Cypress Creek Methodist Church. It was wonderful to see the Teaching Kitchen in action during this wonderful week of camp.

This camp was possible through generous grants from Harold Bate Foundation, Jones Onslow EMC and LifePlus Foundation and partnerships with Atlantic Dance Theatre, NC Cooperative Extension and our amazing church partners.

Our Board of Directors enjoyed a $\frac{1}{2}$ day camp (board development) with Armstrong McGuire, Todd Brantley, Senior Advisor. The various working sessions consisted of hearing the feedback from the organizational surveys, stakeholder interviews and client focus groups. The group was able to identify critical areas to focus on as the organization continues to grow. The Board of Directors enjoyed a home-cooked lunch by Jimmy and Hilda Bender to kick off the $\frac{1}{2}$ day event. We are grateful for Armstrong McGuire coming along beside our organization empowering, equipping and educating the leadership team on how to be a "high performing culture".

Table Talk with 4-H/NC Cooperative Extension/Jones County - a 2 day (all day) camp for 8-14 year old children in Jones County. This is our 2nd year partnering with Samantha Bennett, 4-H agent, and Sarah Ware, Consumer and Family Sciences to bring "Table Talk" to our campus. 4-H'ers had so much fun at Table Talk camp. Over two days, 4-H'ers learned about manners, etiquette, table settings, kitchen safety, cooking skills, flower arrangements, invitations, and thank you cards. They topped it all off with preparing a three course meal for local County

officials: County Commissioner, April Aycock; County Commissioner, Charlie Dunn; County Manager, Kyle Smith; and Extension Director, Jacob Morgan.

Camp Noah - Resiliency Camp for Children K-5 was held August 7-11. YMCA/New River in Jacksonville connected with us in January to explore the possibilities of The Filling Station to host Camp Noah - a nationwide resiliency camp for children. This camp was funded through Lutheran Services in MN and support staff from YMCA/New River led the camp activities. 23 children from Jones County received resiliency training. The feedback from parents was very positive. Marcy Hoffman was the site coordinator for Camp Noah. Several church partners, donations from Century 21/ Zaytoun Raines and leadership from NC Cooperative Extension/Jones County helped to make the lunches possible in the Teaching Kitchen.

Back to School Bash - this is the 3rd year The Filling Station has served on this committee with Jones County Recreation bringing this school kick off event. Over 250 backpacks filled with snacks were given to the students as they entered the event. Numerous vendors were on site handing out school supplies as students visited each booth. As a special treat, 1784 Cafe brought their mobile unit to serve smoothies. Funds from the Neuse River Bridge Run helped to make this Back to School event a success.

The Amateur Radio Course was a huge success. This 7 week course equipped 8 new radio technicians with the skills to use Ham Radio which is especially important in times of disaster and communications are impacted. This course was made possible by partnerships with New Bern

Amateur Radio Club and Jones County Emergency Management. The next level course will kick off Sept 30: https://fillingstation1075.com/amateur-radio-license-class-information/

















Jones County Heritage Festival—September 22-23



The Filling Station, a dream born out of a long vacant, propane company building, opened its doors on August 28, 2017. Why the Filling Station name? During a walkthrough of the building, someone noticed a red hazardous material warning sign with a flame and the number 1075, the DOT classification for propane. The group discovered that Psalm 107:5 read: "They were hungry and thirsty; their lives were slipping away." A new mission was launched and it was called "The Filling Station" to refer to the building's prior use as well as to its new purpose.
