Harold H. Bate Foundation—25 Years of Giving & Granting



Dear Mary,

On behalf of myself and the New Bern Amateur Radio Club I would like to thank you and your organization for the most generous use of your facility. In these times it is hard to find an organization which will sponsor "Ham Radio" classes. Most of time they are not interested or do not have the facility to accommodate such a venture. Your facility provided an excellent environment for both teaching and of course learning. The students were comfortable in the environment which in turn lead directly to their attentiveness.

As with most "Ham Radio" class we started with more than we finished with. In this instance we started with eleven students and finished with ten. This by far much better than an average attendance at the end of the class. Of the 10 students that completed the course all but one earned their General Class Amateur Radio license, of which was far above average when it comes to passing the test.

You may or may not know that Amateur Radio operators play a significant role in emergency communication during disaster, both natural and manmade. Amateur Radio operators set up and operate organized communication networks locally for governmental and emergency officials, as well as non-commercial communication for private citizens affected a disaster. Amateur Radio operators are most likely to be active after disasters that damage regular lines of communications due to power outages and/or destruction of telephone, cellular and other critical infrastructure systems.

By allowing me to teach Amateur Radio your organization has made a significant positive impact in our community. I thank you very much and hope to work with you soon on a more Amateur Radio Classes.


