We hope you and your families had a wonderful holiday season and kickoff to a New Year. 2026 marks the beginning of the 9th year of dreaming, planning and working on fueling The Filling Station mission. Every year I choose 3 new words as a filter for the mission outlined in our Strategic Plan. 2026 WORDS: Adventure, Curious, Present

As the Filling Station develops, we must stay curious about ways to be present on the 2026 adventure. So much to look forward to this New Year! Before we say goodbye to 2025, let's CELEBRATE all great work in the last 2 months. 2025 3 Words: Celebrate, Laugh, Rest. We encountered lots of challenges completing a major building project which reminded us to laugh and rest along the way.

What happened in November and December?

- Served over 1658 households from the Food Pantry
- 956 Volunteer hours (food pantry, admin and facilities)
 - Leadership Jones - 14 Graduates
- Ham Radio Course - 25 new licensed technicians
- Sponsored Angels with the Salvation Army and Operation Christmas Child
 - Nutrition Education Classes held with N.C Cooperative Extension
- Partnership with Pollocksville Elementary School - Lighthouse Leadership Project
- Participated in Giving Tuesday Event with New Bern Chamber of Commerce
- Christmas on Main Event serving cocoa, coffee and letters to Santa
 - Awarded a grant from International Paper \$6000
 - Awarded a grant from Bate Foundation \$20,000
 - Awarded a grant from Weyerhaeuser \$3000
- Achieved our goal to raise \$70,000 during “A Perfect 10” event - thank you Anonymous Trust for challenging us each year.







Amateur Radio License Class



AMATEUR RADIO LICENSE CLASS

The Filling Station is in partnership with the New Bern Amateur Radio Club and Jones County Emergency Management will be holding a Ham Radio Licensing Class for the General Class License. It is recommended that students hold a current Technician Class License. The Class is open to all ages and will prepare the students for the FCC Elements 3 exam, General Class.

As with all current FCC Amateur Radio License there is NO Morse Code required. The course covers regulations, operating practices, electronic theory and safety. The class is FREE but the student should purchase the ARRL Ham Radio License Manual 10th Edition Study Guide for the General Class license. The Study Guide can be purchased from Amazon or the ARRL book store at www.arrl.org.



The Filling Station, a dream born out of a long vacant, propane company building, opened its doors on August 28, 2017. Why the Filling Station name?

During a walk-through of the building, someone noticed a red hazardous material warning sign with a flame and the number 1075, the DOT classification for propane. The group discovered that Psalm 107:5 read: "They were hungry and thirsty; their lives were slipping away." A new mission was launched and it was called "The Filling Station" to refer to the building's prior use as well as to its new purpose. Our mission is to assist with filling unmet needs in the areas of Nutrition, Education, and Connection serving the residents of Jones County.
